


Let's talk...

Wedding flower budgets



As with all things to do with your wedding, how much money you want to spend on your flowers is deeply personal and there's no right or wrong answer! It's about you and your style.





So budget accordingly - if flowers are your main decoration and something you dream of, then set aside as much of your budget as feels comfortable.

But if they're a token, something you feel you 'need' but aren't too fussed about, don't feel guilty for cutting back on them so that you can prioritise other things.

In this guide I've given some questions and some examples to help you understand the right budget for your wedding flowers.



If money was no object, what would you want your wedding florals to be like?

Do you dream of having a fairytale wedding with flowers filling every space.

Of large statement florals for every part of your day?

Even if you could afford anything, do you actually not want a big, flowery show but instead a simple set of florals for the bridal party?



Having thought about the dream, let's start thinking of the reality...

What are your priorities?

If you had to make compromises, where would they be?
Would you sacrifice other elements for the flowers of your dreams?

Or would you be cutting back on flowers to spend your money elsewhere?

Which floral elements are your priorities?
Is a bouquet for yourself non-negotiable?

What about the buttonholes?
Would you trade table flowers for a statement entrance?

If your budget is £150...

That could get you:

- a bridal bouquet of local, seasonal blooms in my signature style and finished with trailing silk ribbons
- a buttonhole finished with matching silk ribbon
- delivery to a Gloucestershire location on your wedding day.

if you have a £1000 budget...

you could have:

- personal flowers for the couple (bouquets / buttonholes), finished with my signature ribbons
- delicate bouquets and buttonholes for a small bridal party e.g. two 'maids and groomsmen
- a simple ceremony table piece
- a selection of bud vases for the wedding breakfast
- delivery and setup on your wedding day, plus collection the day after

if you have £1500-£2000 to spend...

we could:

- expand your wedding party flowers - larger bouquets, more bouquets, more high-end focal flowers
- a focal installation for your ceremony, such as a small broken arch or plinth installation
- dainty aisle decorations, such as small vases or a small number of aisle meadows
- a selection of bud vases for the wedding breakfast
- delivery and setup on your wedding day, plus collection the day after


With a budget of £2500 you could have...

- flowers for a larger wedding party flowers or for larger bouquets for the 'maids
- additional details such as flower crowns
- statement ceremony pieces e.g. plinths with large arrangements to frame your vows
- some decoration down the aisle, such as a selection of meadows
- a selection of flowers for your wedding cake table or to accompany signage
- larger centrepieces for the wedding breakfast or centrepieces for more tables
- delivery and setup on your wedding day including moving from ceremony to reception, plus collection the day after
